Manna

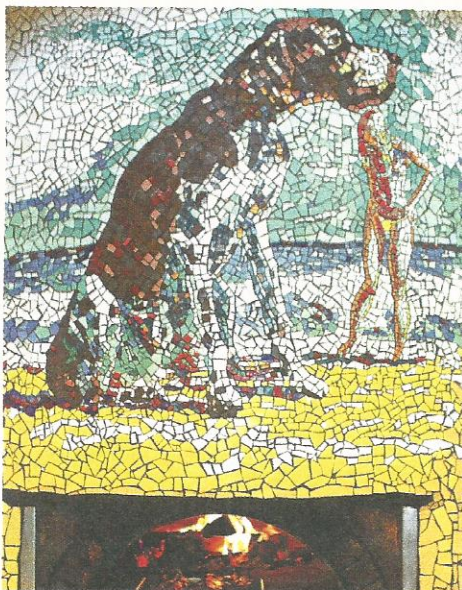
