



HIDDEN LUXURY

THE MOST INDULGENT SPA IN THE HAMPTONS IS ALSO THE AREA'S BEST-KEPT SECRET. BY CRYSTAL MARTIN

The Baker House 1650 is just the right blend of cozy and opulent—a vacation destination plucked from daydreams of summer on the East End. But hidden below the bed-and-breakfast's Cotswoldsinspired building is arguably its greatest asset: a private spa.

Even the most luxurious spas are divided into treatment rooms, but at the **Baker Spa**, one 800-square-foot room—with lap pool, sauna, steam shower, and Jacuzzi—is reserved for one client or couple at a time. "To have this big room to yourself, it adds a complete layer of luxury," says co-owner Antonella Bertello, who has personally vetted all the spa's therapists and swears by the deep tissue massage (\$180 for 90 minutes).

The Baker Spa is technically open only to hotel guests, but you can also secure an appointment as a "friend of the house"-a longtime hotel patron who has bought a home in the Hamptons. Barring that, management may be able to squeeze you in during the offseason. But be warned: "We're having less and less of an off-season season," says Bertello. "I have to make my own appointments at 7 AM because we're so booked. And I have some influence here." 181 Main St., East Hampton, 324-4081; bakerhouse 1650.com
