



The mid-17th century building was once known as Baker's Tavern and served as the location for various community and religious meetings. Over time, it evolved into what it is today, providing a charming retreat for guests who need a break from today's hurried pace.

At the risk of sounding cliché, cozy, warm and quaint are actually fitting descriptions for every area of the property. The guest rooms, aptly designated by familiar East End names such as Gardiner and Maidstone, are appointed with a rustic, colonial charm. The separate seating areas allow you to curl up in front of the fireplace with a good book from the downstairs library.

In the evening, after a night on the town, you can stop by the Baker Bar, located on the first floor, and pour yourself a nightcap, all on the honor system. In the morning, head downstairs for a swim, massage or steam shower at the spectacular spa, then to the dining room for a delicious, homemade breakfast (which may just put you right back to sleep). When you return to this remarkable inn in the warmer months (and there's no doubt you will), you'll enjoy the long, heated outdoor swimming pool surrounded by a garden, reminiscent of an English manor house, with 200-year-old wisterias and vine-covered walls.
